-Working to support and promote youth and club women's ultimate in Minnesota by: partnering with GUPI and providing support as needed; coaching high school women's teams and co-ed middle school teams; helping to organize and run youth clinics; publicly supporting GUPI and girl's ultimate through social media, word-of-mouth, and our actions; and being an ambassador for women in ultimate on a national scale when representing Pop at tournaments, as well as off the frisbee field.
